

Laws exist to make sure that rehabilitation facilities safeguard your privacy. If a facility operates on tax-exemption, as an NGO, or is funded by the federal government, your privacy is protected by federal law. The law indicates that the rehab center is forbidden to divulge your records without your explicit consent in writing. The only exception allowed is when law enforcement agencies subpoena such records regarding a criminal or civil inquiry. In the absence of such, the facility must uphold your request for privacy.
