Xanax is the brand name of the drug Alprazolam. Alprazolam is a monitored substance that doctors prescribe to treat anxiety and panic disorders. It may also be prescribed to treat depression, agoraphobia, and premenstrual syndrome. In all of these cases, Alprazolam is designed to depress the nervous system and provide a calming sensation for those who use it.

Alprazolam comes in several types of pill form and a liquid. When taking the medication, it is crucial to follow the use instructions on the side. Failure to follow used instructions can lead to widespread problems with dependence and addiction.

Is Xanax Addictive?

Xanax is an addictive medication, and your doctor will monitor the prescription amount and length of use. However, if you've been taking Xanax recreationally, you may feel the effects of dependence and addiction sooner, and without someone to monitor, this could be extremely dangerous.

Xanax addiction can cause users to feel:

- Drowsiness
- Lightheadedness
- Headache
- Tiredness
- Dizziness
- Irritability
- Talkativeness
- Difficulty concentrating
- Dry mouth
- Increased salivation
- Sexual drive or ability changes
- Nausea, constipation, and changes in appetite
- Weight changes,
- difficulty urinating
- Joint pain

Your doctor typically monitors these side effects of use. Recreational use may indicate a higher occurrence of these side effects because the drug is not being adequately monitored.

The use of Alprazolam can also cause several severe side effects that individuals who use the drug as prescribed and those who use it recreationally should be aware of. Take Alprazolam, and you have shortness of breath, seizures, severe skin rash, yellowing of the skin or eyes, confusion, problems with speech, or problems with coordination or balance. You should contact your doctor immediately.

An individual who is overdosing on Xanax may experience drowsiness, confusion, problems with coordination, and loss of consciousness. Taking Alprazolam as prescribed is the most common and easiest way to prevent addiction symptoms. Xanax and Xanax XR should not be taken with any other drugs or alcohol. Your doctor may also recommend against drinking grapefruit juice while taking this medication.

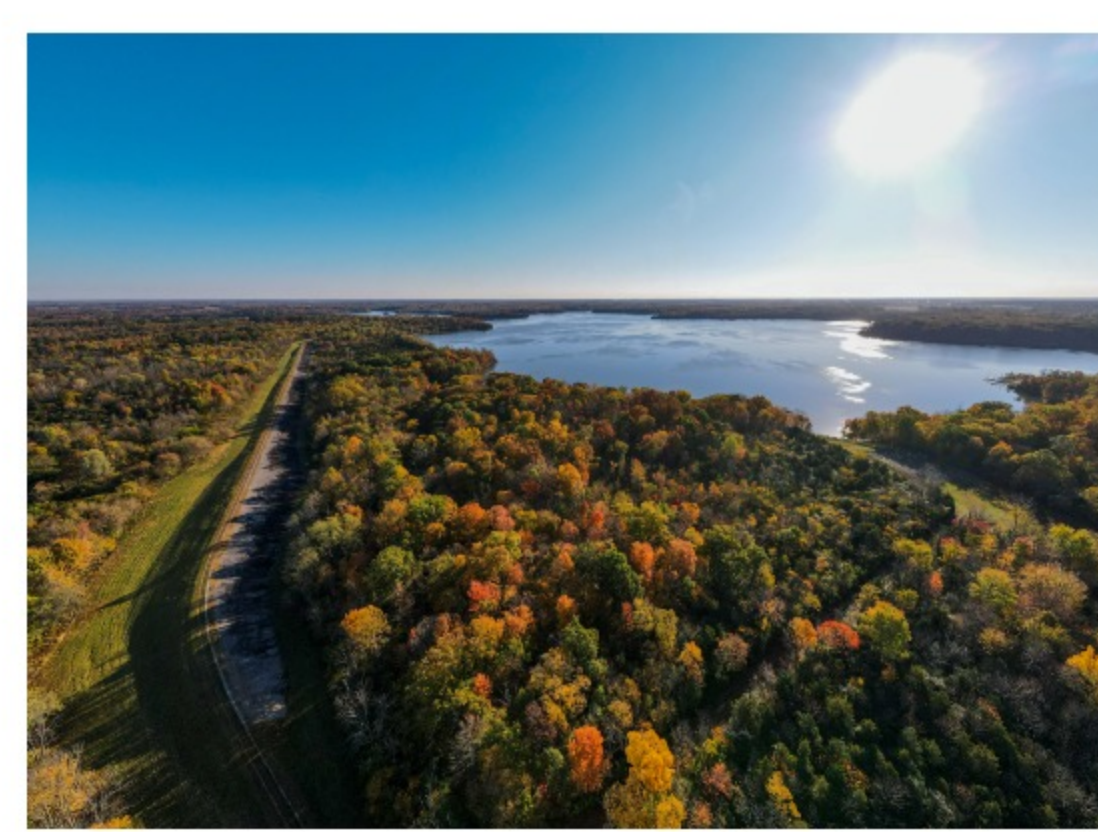

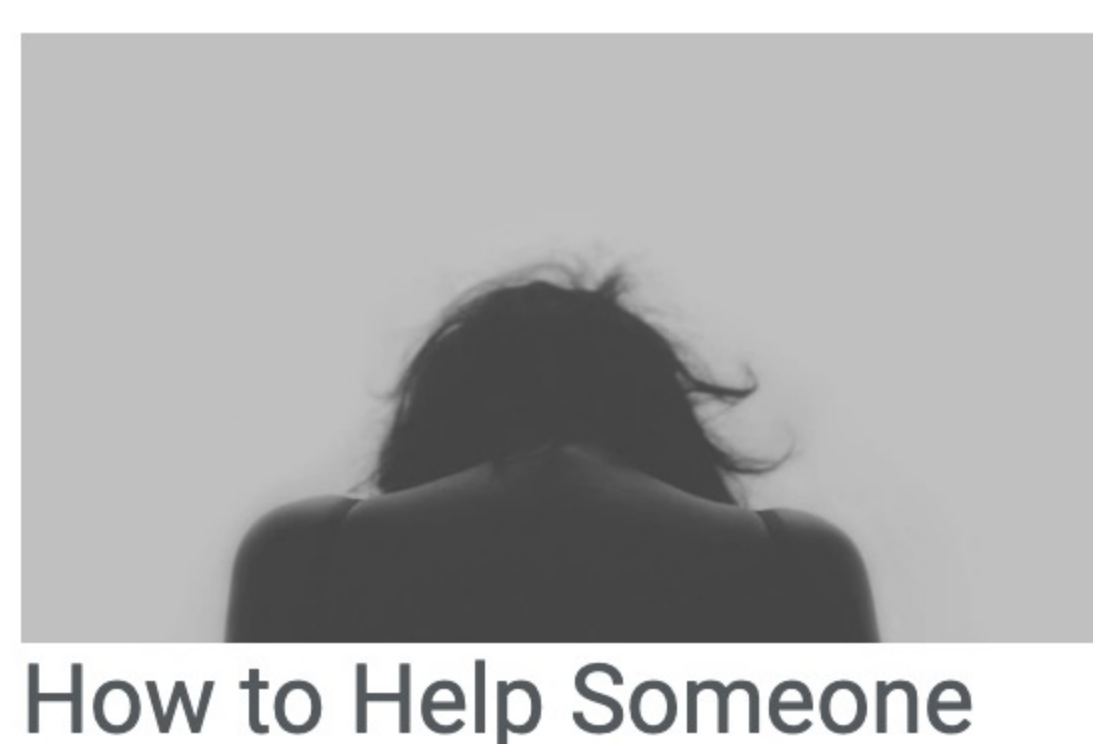

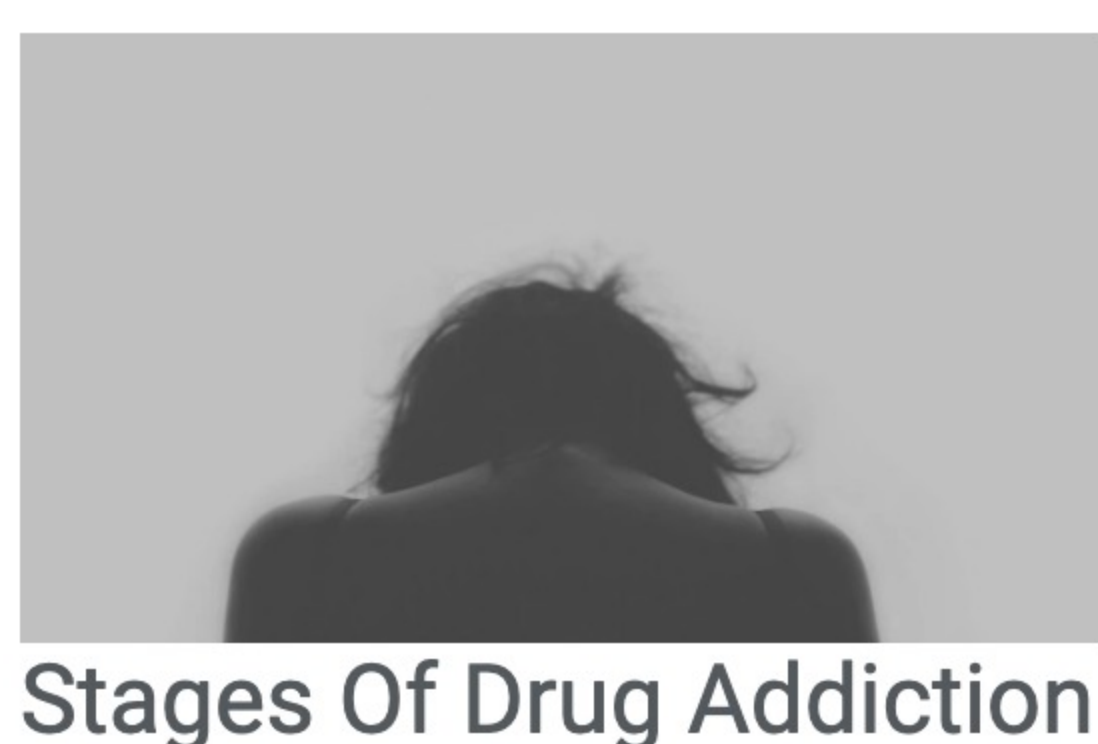
